COMMENTS FROM THE CHAIR

I recently heard on the radio that the trade wars started by President Trump are costing the average American family \$1,300.00 annually! At his rallies and on Twitter he likes to brag that these embargoes are bringing in trillions and trillions of dollars to the federal government. In typical Trumpian fashion the numbers are greatly exaggerated, with serious facts omitted entirely, like the fact that most of that additional revenue is being paid by American consumers in the form of higher

prices. Or the fact that his trade policies are doing serious damage to certain industries, like agriculture, and steel. All his trade wars have accomplished so far is to create an opportunity for importers and retailers to raise their prices. Given an opportunity like that, does anyone really think that they have passed on to consumers only the cost of the new tariffs and not yielded to temptation and added a little extra to fatten the coffers? With corporate accounts swollen with profits one has to wonder.

Trump also promised us great new trade deals when he revoked NAFTA and took the United States out of the Trans-Pacific Partnership Agreement. Now we have a new trade agreement with Mexico and Canada that offers some improvements over NAFTA but most experts agree that the new deal is not substantially better than what we had before. Ending NAFTA was unnecessary and seriously disruptive of trade with our neighbors, trade that we all depend upon.

For example: The new agreement does not go far enough in addressing the advantages that Canada enjoys in the dairy industry. Our neighbor Wisconsin has been hit very hard with many dairy operations going out of business. Just last week, Borden (think Else the Cow) company announced that it has filed for bankruptcy.

The damage done to the long-term health of our country has been even worse with our withdrawal from the Trans-Pacific Partnership Agreement negotiated by the Obama administration. This was an agreement that would have put the United States in a strong competitive economic position in Asia. Emerging economies like Cambodia, Laos, Vietnam, and others are now turning to China and forging new trade agreements that put the United States at a serious economic disadvantage for some time to come. China is filling a gap that was created by Trump.

And so, on trade, as well many other issues, emperor Trump really doesn't have on any clothes. Yikes, no there's an image; Trump with no clothes! Finally, in this most important election year we need to educate ourselves about these and other issues so that we more effectively educate others and perhaps persuade them to not only get out and vote but to vote for more effective leaders of this great country.

Jimmy Carter was prophetic when he was interviewed about his book “A Call to Action” in 2014

David Daley; In your book “A Call To Action”, you very clearly call out the speed with which the United States jumps into military action. You write that, “more than any nation in the world, the U.S. has been involved in armed conflict and has used war as means of resolving disputes...”

Jimmy Carter: That’s correct, and I list some of the wars. I listed 10 or 15 and I could have listed about 10 or 15 more.

David Daley: We also rarely acknowledge the loss and suffering that our policies have caused around the world. You’re specifically critical our drone wars, and of the innocent people we’ve killed as almost collateral damage. You’ve traveled to so many countries through the Carter Center: At home, we talk of American exceptionalism, of this duty to bring our great democracy to the rest of the world. Do we see ourselves accurately and understand our own history? And how does that square with how the rest of the world perceives us?

Jimmy Carter: (laughs) No. The rest of the world, almost unanimously, looks at America as the No. 1 warmonger. That we revert to armed conflict almost at the drop of a hat - and quite often it’s not only desired by the leaders of our country, but it’s also supported by the people of America.

During his six years in the House, Gary drew on his business background to make Washington more transparent and accountable and led efforts in Congress to eliminate wasteful and unnecessary spending. He also served on the Wall Street Reform Conference Committee and was integral in developing landmark financial reform legislation that created the Consumer Finance Protection Bureau and prohibits the risky behavior that caused the financial crisis.

In the U.S. Senate, Gary serves on the Armed Services Committee; Commerce, Science and Transportation Committee; Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee; and the Joint Economic Committee. He is focused on strengthening our middle class by protecting access to quality, affordable health care, preparing our kids for the jobs of tomorrow and helping small businesses grow. Gary and his wife Colleen are the proud parents of three, a son and two daughters, and lives in Oakland County.
